## **Marble Dye Project**

1st Grade

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#### I. Standards and Benchmarks

#### II. Outcomes:

### **III.** Anticipatory Set/Motivation:

Demonstrate the process and show examples of water marbling, both professional and instructor created examples

## IV. Model the Process:

#### Criteria:

- 4 colors max
- 9x12 paper
- Name on back

#### **Task Analysis:**

Must know how to apply paint and swirl without diluting

# Vocabulary:

Color, paint, movement, rhythm, pattern, contrast, visual texture

#### **Materials:**

Watercolor paper, cornstarch goop, acrylic paint, alum, eye droppers, paint brushes, popsicle sticks, toothpicks, plastic forks, disposable cups, large aluminum pans, water, paper towel, non water soluble writing utensil

# **Demonstration:**

- Prep watercolor paper and cornstarch goop
- Prep work station: Put goop in pan, pan for water bath, dilute acrylic paints in cups and all tools
- Drop paint into cornstarch pan with eye droppers (brushes, popsicle sticks)
- Swirl paint with toothpicks (plastic forks, paint brush)
- Drop watercolor paper into pan face down leave for one minute
- Pull paper out of pan and place into water bath, swishing gently
- Remove paper from water and leave to dry

### V. Check for Understanding:

Are they able to choose colors? Are they able to hold tools for dropping and swirling? Are they able to drop watercolor paper into pan and remove to place into water bath? VI. Monitor and Adjust: Make sure they know to apply enough paint to cover paper and they are not swishing paint too much VII. Accommodations: Holding paint cups close for visual impairment, help with dropping paper into pan and hand over hand for limited motor skills, using larger tools such plastic forks or paint brushes to swirl paint. Being vigilant to prevent spills and avoid ingesting materials. Additional auditory direction and hand over hand for blind student. VIII. Clean Up: 15 minutes IX.
